TYPES OF GRANTS AVAILABLE:

The objective of this RFP process is to identify transformational ideas that will encourage greater collaboration among organizations, increase engagement, and enhance community building. Federation is focusing on both increasing impact (expansion/scaling of existing initiatives) and innovation (launch of new initiatives). Federation encourages organizations to submit proposals for initiatives in one or both areas, and to consider collaborating with other organizations.

IMPACT GRANTS (EXPANSION/SCALING) These grants will enable strong programs to make greater impact by expanding or replicating an already proven initiative in the community. To be considered for funding, proposals must align with areas of focus, variables identified, and impact expectations.

INNOVATION GRANTS (NEW PILOT INITIATIVES) These grants will enable organizations to pilot new programs that have never before been run in the Greater Washington Jewish community or are in the early phase of idea/program development. Selected programs will target marginalized or underserved populations or address needs not currently addressed within our areas of focus. New opportunities with both local and national partners will be accepted. Where appropriate, a local organization may bring a national program to the community.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLYING ORGANIZATIONS:

- Tax-exempt organizations or individuals affiliated with a fiscal sponsor
- Must offer programs that are welcoming, inclusive, and reflect Jewish values
- Submit requested financial documentation
- Agree to clearly identify on program marketing materials that, "this program is powered by The Jewish Federation of Greater Washington"
- Promote appropriate programs and offerings of Federation and other grantees to your participants/members



PROPOSALS ACCEPTED AROUND THE FOLLOWING:

Program collaboration across the community is strongly encouraged and will be weighted favorably in the evaluation process.

ENGAGING THE NEXT GENERATION (NEXT GEN)

Audience: post college singles, couples, families with young children

STRENGTHENING JEWISH LIFE IN NORTHERN VIRGINIA (NOVA)

Audience: open

Federation is particularly interested in projects that directly address a component of our vision (see above) and incorporate one or more of the following aspects:

- Addresses underserved or marginalized populations in the Jewish community
- Furthers collective efforts enabling the Jewish community to act as a force for good in the world
- Maximizes the capabilities of two or more organizations through collaboration
- Offers a new model or mechanism for service delivery
- Enables the smooth transition of populations across life stages
