GatherDC will expand their 30s Engagement Impact program to connect individuals in their 30s with their peers and Jewish communal partner organizations. The project also funds dedicated learning and leadership experiences for this population, including comprehensive follow-up and evaluation.

Program Goals

1. Connect Jewish 30s to each other so that they find their people, place, and discover a lasting adult Jewish identity.
2. Strengthen the entire ecosystem of Jewish DC for young adults, making it more inclusive, diverse, welcoming, and relevant. Identify future leaders, philanthropists, and conveners of Jewish life.
3. Connect them to Jewish organizations that meet their needs and increase participation in Jewish events and programs across the community.

Metrics

5 Jewish experiences focused on participants in their 30s

Q1: Planned for 2 curated Shabbat dinners, a 3-week Jewish learning series, and peer-led Friendsgiving

Q2: Facilitated 6 gatherings for 95 Jewish individuals in their 30s including Shabbat dinners, Jewish holiday service projects, a Jewish learning cohort, and a peer-led Friendsgiving Shabbat.

Q1: 30s Engagement director starts to plan 1 on 1 meetings

Q2: 79 coffee meetings were held to connect 1 to 1 and learn insights about connecting to people in their 30s
