COVID Impact: The program pivoted to becoming completely virtual. Initially, the JFamily Ambassador program was a vertical branch in the Family Engagement department and operated as such. With all programs running virtually, the need for individual neighborhood offerings was no longer critical and the department was able to merge with the Center's Family Engagement Department.
